Learn about monitoring the “*most frequently listed*” TMDL Water Quality indicators (bacteria, dissolved oxygen, temperature and turbidity) as well as aquatic macro invertebrates.

- The first 2 days (Tuesday, Wednesday) of the program will focus on technical aspects of monitoring (both classroom and hands-on sessions included):
 - ✓ What do you want from your monitoring activity?
 - ✓ Doing your homework — before you start monitoring
 - ✓ Selecting testing methods based on intended data uses
 - ✓ Factors influencing data
 - ✓ Quality assurance/quality control considerations
 - ✓ Data collection, storage and interpretation
 - ✓ Using and presenting results

- The final day (½ day Thursday) will focus on developing, managing and sustaining volunteer monitoring programs. Topics to include:
 - ✓ Training formats
 - ✓ Retention and recognition
 - ✓ Volunteer roles and potential responsibilities
 - ✓ Empowering citizens with data
